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FAQs

Q: What version of code is covered in the NASCLA Electrical Journeyman examination?

A: The examination is over the 2017 NEC code. A list of reference materials is provided upon registering for the examination.

Q: What version of code is covered in the NASCLA Electrical Master examination?

A: The examination is over the 2017 NEC code. A list of reference materials is provided upon registering for the examination.

Q: How do I schedule my NASCLA Electrical Journeyman or NASCLA **Electrical Master examination?**

A: Applicants can register for an examination online through PSI or by calling the PSI Candidate Service Center at (855) 340-3713.

Q: What is the examination fee for both the NASCLA Electrical Journeyman and NASCLA Electrical Master examination?

A: The examination fee is \$75.

Q: How long is the NASCLA Electrical Journeyman examination through PSI?

A: 5 hours.

Q: How long is the NASCLA Electrical Master examination through PSI?

A: 4.5 hours.

Q: Can I bring food/drink or personal items into the testing area?

A: No.

Q: Where is the closest testing center to me?

A: Applicants may enter their city/state or zip code on the PSI website to locate the nearest testing center.

Q: What do I do if I fail?

A: Applicants can reschedule an examination online through <u>PSI</u> or by calling Candidate Service Center at (855) 340-3713. There is no waiting period to retest.

Q: What if I applied through DOPL first and have not scheduled an examination for licensure?

A: Applicants should schedule the applicable examination online through <u>PSI</u> or by calling Candidate Service Center at (855) 340-3713. Examination scores will be sent directly to DOPL upon completion. If the candidate successfully passes the examination, they will be contacted by our office to collect the license fee and any additional information required for licensure.

Q: Can I take the Electrical Journeyman or Electrical Master examination in your office?

A: No. DOPL no longer offers those exams in-house and has partnered with PSI to proctor those exams.

Q: I already have a test scheduled for one of the DOPL offices, can I cancel that exam and get a refund?

A: Yes. The applicant must submit a refund request to DOPL via email at tradelicensing@dopl.idaho.gov.

Q: Does PSI offer practice tests?

A: Yes. Practice tests are available on the PSI website under the *Test Prep Score* tab upon scheduling an examination.

Q: Does PSI offer examination accommodations?

A: Yes. Applicants must apply for an accommodation prior to scheduling an examination. Accommodation information is on the <u>PSI</u> website. Once the request is approved, you may schedule your exam.

Q: Where can I obtain a list of reference materials for the examination?

A: Upon booking an exam, applicants will receive an <u>examination bulletin</u>. A list of reference materials is provided within the bulletin.

Q: Can my reference materials be tabbed out?

A: Reference material may be highlighted, underlined, and/or indexed. They must be otherwise unmarked (not written in) and may <u>not</u> contain additional papers (loose or attached). THESE REFERENCES WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE IN THE EXAMINATION CENTER. References may be tabbed/indexed with permanent tabs only. <u>Temporary tabs</u>, such as Post-It notes, are not allowed and must be removed from the reference material before the examination

begins.

Q: Will I receive my test result right away?

A: Yes. A score report will be issued at the conclusion of the examination.

Q: How do I cancel/reschedule my appointment through PSI?

A: Applicants may cancel or reschedule an examination appointment without forfeiting the fee if the cancellation notice is received 48 hours before the scheduled examination date. Applicants may call PSI at (855)-340-3713 or cancel/reschedule online. Missed examinations will result in a forfeiture of the examination fee.

Q: I took my examination through PSI, now what?

A: Once applicants successfully meet the minimum requirements for licensure, they may submit an application. Current applications are available online on the <u>Electrical Board webpage</u>.
